Folkart showcases a range of skills, from the unknown 'ship-in-a bottle' or ship model maker, to embroidered seascapes known as 'woollies'; from 'pierhead' paintings - ship portraits for seafarers - to the basket maker, the net maker, the rope-splicer, and the wood-carver - among many others.
